<b>Member/Agency Updates</b>	<p><b>Danette Glassy</b> – Healthy Child Care America looking at what has been happening to state organized child care health consultation. Heidi Collins put together a summary of what had happened in Washington State.</p> <p><b>Within Reach</b>- Pink Book training for nurses on immunizations will be held in September 16-17. Flier is posted on the CSHEL website and Within Reach website.</p> <p><b>Free STARS class</b> - CSHEL online class on adult immunizations will be available to the end of June – 2 free STARS credits for child care providers.</p> <p><b>Gail Gensler</b> – 2 things frequently come up in child cares when she is doing consultations on toxics – vacuum cleaners and hand soaps. Working on putting together a list of bulk hand soaps that are free of antimicrobials, scents, and dyes. Also putting together a list of bagged vacuums with HEPA bags and HEPA filters. King County will reimburse half of the price of a vacuum that meets the criteria up to \$500. 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	<p>only health person in office, and 3 health specialists in the field. Need to improve health. Need a state system to back up private health consultation.</p> <p>Focus on comprehensive health strategy but was voted down. Early Learning Plan includes elements but parts are not implemented. Shorter list of priorities this year.</p> <p><b>Katy Levenhagen</b> – with Adrienne Dorf (DEL), put together a presentation on physical activity and nutrition for licensors and reached them all. Child Care Obesity Prevention coalition developing a draft press release about the status of physical activity in child care right now based on a survey done by the UW a couple years ago.</p> <p><b>Danette Glassy</b> - AAP has free online trainings on safe sleep, communicable disease, medication administration, etc. New one will be on Safety coming out in 2016.</p> <p><b>Cathe Paul</b> – doing private consultation still; conversations with DEL about MERIT, not enough qualified trainers who are health professionals to do trainings due to very challenging requirements to apply and submit CEUs – Cathe will continue conversations.</p> <p><b>Jennifer Helseth</b> – school district sites are not renewing their ECEAP grants because of early achievers requirements that they also have to meet. Child care partnerships are also gone.</p> <p><b>Sue White</b> – Completed Public Health Seattle-King County model health policy update (for School-age and Child Care) with new bleach recommendations and hope to have it on the website by next week. King County is still signing policies for \$50.</p> <p><b>Nancy Tarara</b> – ECEAP program vision therapy. Invited to be on safety committee for ECEAP. Infant toddler program had reliability training. Licensors are stating that immunizations are not consistent now that consultation programs are taken away.</p> <p><b>Suzanne Kohaya</b> - nearing 5000 slots. Going through CFCAP review in next weeks.</p>	
<p><b>Grant Received</b></p> <p><i>Update by Peggy King</i></p>	<p>Best Start Washington (Washington Chapter of AAP) got a grant from DEL that has come from CSHEL. The purpose is to grow CSHEL. Money will be used to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) improve communication system – list serv and web page</li> <li>2) find private health consultants and Head Start/ECEAP consultants</li> <li>3) improve capacity to train and mentor and coach</li> </ol> <p>Part of the grant is to take the Infant Toddler class produced by Snohomish Health District to use for training consultants. Will add nutrition and physical activity to this class.</p>	

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	<p>Survey will be done – what kind of needs are there in terms of physical activity and nutrition or infant toddler comprehensive health and what type of systems are needing to be in place.</p>	
<b>Differences with private consultant</b>	<p>As a private health consultant, director is the driver so if the director doesn't agree with what nurse advises they technically don't need to follow advice. In some cases nursing contracts have been cancelled due to unwillingness to follow WACs and best practice advice.</p> <p>As a public health consultant – there is more weight of a system to get changes made in a child care. Whatever the system is, it must involve public health.</p> <p>What should be part of a system? What would be the ideal system for child care comprehensive health system (for infants and toddlers specifically), regardless of cost? Think about issues and what could/should be implemented.</p> <p>Features from CSHEL about systems that work to post on the website.</p>
